Education Grants which beneficiaries of Tamatea Te Waati Tairaroa Whanau Trust (TTTWT) may apply for:

1. Tuwharetoa Maori Trust Board (TMTB):

1. Year 12 and 13—exam fees only
2. Apprentices
3. Special Needs Students
4. Grants open: 1st February in each year; Grants close: 30th June each year.
5. No grants for primary, intermediate or for those studying overseas.

6. University students, including post graduate students. Students attending a polytechnic, technical institute, community college to study a NZQA authorized course of study. Ten scholarships p.a. worth \$1,000. Applications open 1 December and close 28 February.

1. Grants are available for university study, polytechnic or vocational training
2. The Trust looks for “commitment and focus on the part of the applicants” and any information applicants can provide in support will assist.
3. Applications to the Secretary must be received before 31 March.
4. There is no indication of individual amounts granted...however, in 2007 grants totalled \$36,300.

1. Payment will be made on Education Fees only including gst.
2. Requires details of course of study, previous results, letter from Principal.
3. Money is paid direct to school or institute
4. A maximum of \$10,000 is available annually; a minimum payment of \$100 will be paid; there are two scholarships of \$2,000 available to A Bursary students who are attending first year at university.
5. Applicants applying for the second year must provide copy of previous year's results.
6. Applications close 31st March and payouts will be by 30th May.

1. Grants are only made for tertiary education for those who have financial difficulty in obtaining the education they seek without assistance. Evidence of your student, unemployment and/or beneficiary status needs to be provided.
2. Preference will be given to residents of Pipiriki or remote areas.
3. Details of course, fees, and related costs (eg books, stationery, accommodation, travel etc) need to be supplied.
4. Applications on forms provided need to be submitted by beginning of September each year.

- one farm training scholarship for \$14,000 for one year
- two trade training scholarships for \$1,000 for two years
- one hundred grants of \$250 for tertiary students
- fifty grants of \$110 for Year 13 students.
